Monika Baár holds a doctorate in Modern History from the University of Oxford (2002) and subsequently held a two-year Postdoctoral Fellowship at the Max Planck Institute for the History of Science in Berlin and a two-year Teaching Fellowship at the University of Essex. She also held fellowships at the Centro Incontri Umani, Ascona (Switzerland), the Free University Berlin, Institute for Advanced Study in Edinburgh, Collegium Budapest and the National Humanities Centre, Canberra. Before joining the Institute for History at Leiden University in 2015 she was Rosalind Franklin Fellow at the University of Groningen between 2009 and 2015. In June 2017 she was appointed as the holder of the Special Chair for Central European Studies at the Leiden University Institute for History. Professor Baár currently leads the ERC project “Rethinking Disability” at Leiden University.

The lecture will focus on three distinctive cases, each of which has provided models for community-building in their own ways: the Flemish town of Geel, the village “Het Dorp” in the Netherlands, and the achievements of Italian psychiatric reform in the 1970s, especially those of Franco Basaglia
